2023-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Christmas season is now behind us, the decorations are packed away, and we are in the Liturgical Season of Ordinary Time (Year A). Just the day-to-day, run-of-the-mill time, which, we are told, is the perfect time to make unordinary tasks, the essentials of Ordinary Time.

This week's readings lead us into Ordinary Time with a reflection on who we are called to be as Christians. As Christians we are called to a standard of behaviour that should be worthy of a Christian. Whether at work, at home, on the road, in church. Wherever we find ourselves, we're supposed to live as Christ would live, speak as he would speak and do as he would do.

The scriptures today encourage us to discern God's will, and to boldly walk into the future that God calls us into. Thus the critical moments of our lives, individually and collectively can be new horizons of possibility for us, but also beyond us and into the future

It is beneficial to reflect upon what it truly means to be a Christian in our culture today. The last NCL Survey 2022, suggests that we are becoming a minority in the midst of a secular society. It is important that we learn to engage with others as pilgrims, and act as yeast in a critical and disbelieving world.

As we recover from the Covid pandemic, it is hoped that we will not simply return to the patterns of behaviour that cause environmental, economic, and social damage. The Church must also set itself to the task of rebuilding in the wake of the sexual abuse crisis, and must be a humble, and inclusive Church. We must reclaim what Christ stands for, or we will loose our mission of being the light of the world. May we as the body of Christ and as faithful servants, be a sign of hope, and the voice of conscience for our society today.-John France.

WELCOME.

Welcome to St John Vianney Parish, anyone visiting the Lake Macquarie Region during the Summer School Holidays.

Since the mid 1800s there has been a Catholic Presence in our area.

St John Vianney's Parish Morisset was officially formed in 1947.

Previous to 1947 Morisset, belonged to the parishes of Kincumber, Gosford and Wyong. The Mass center of St Patrick and St Brigid at Cooranbong dates back to the 1860's. The Cooranbong Church celebrated it's centenary in August 2006 and its 150th celebration of Catholic presence in 2011.

It is documented that Saint Mary of the Cross (McKillop), visited Cooranbong on at least one occasion where she had a convent and school.

Up until 1966 St John Vianney Parish was part of the Diocese of Sydney, but now belongs to the Diocese of Maitland / Newcastle, with Bishop William Wright as Bishop.

THE aMeN caMiNo PILGRIMAGE 2023

In recent years the Diocese has conducted the aMeN CaMiNo pilgrimage. The aMeN caMiNo takes place over five consecutive days. The pilgrimage starts at St John's Chapel, Maitland and concludes at the Sacred Heart Cathedral, Hamilton Pilgrims will walk an average of 20km per day through the beautiful landscape of bush, beach and beyond which we are blessed to have in our backyard. One of the days they come into Cooranbong where they are treated to hospitality.

It is planned that in 2023 this event will take place in June 17-21, July 8-12 & August 5-9.

THE YEAR THAT WAS-2022

You may remember that during 2022 our Parish was selected to participate in the National Church Life Survey. This Survey was able to provide highlights and a snapshot of Parish life. Hard copies were made available at the Sunday Mass, as well as distributed to those who receive the Weekly Bulletin electronically. At the time of the NCL Survey, Covid still had an influence on everyday life in the community.

Some of the results for our Church.

Those who attend Mass.

73% are female

27% are male

Frequent attenders (monthly or more)

92%

New attenders to the Parish in the last 5 years

31%

Attend via online services

24%

Have a responsibility to care for the environment.

94%

Generally the Church in Australia has been impacted by Covid. Statistics reveal that the number of people who now attend Church Nationally is about 50% pre-Covid. Morisset had about 200 attend Mass/Liturgy of a weekend pre Covid. Now the number is about 90.

NSW CEMETERY AND CREMETORIA-CCNSW

Another significant event that happened in 2022 was the overhaul of the CCNSW Legislation, and the operation and management of Cemeteries and Columbaria..

This overhaul has had a significant and major impact on some of our parishes in the Diocese. Fortunately our Cemetery and Columbarium at Cooranbong Church comply on all fronts with operation and management. Fr Greg Barker the Diocesan Administrator who presided at Mass at Cooranbong last Saturday evening was more than happy with the general care, maintenance and management of the Cemetery. This was Fr Greg's first visit to Cooranbong and he wanted it to be made known how impressed he was with the manner in which the site is maintained and operated. Severe penalties now apply for non compliance, with CCNSW Legislation.

Our Cemetery besides having to comply with CCNSW Legislation, also has the added responsibility to satisfy and comply with Canon Law (Cann1176-1185) regarding the burial of the deceased, and the conservation of ashes in the case of cremation, which was revised in 2016.


