REFLECTION FOR THE FEAST OF THE ASSUMPTION 2021

Today we honour Mary as we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption. Our Catholic Tradition has always honoured Mary, whom we call "Mother of God".

Mary was the first disciple of Jesus, as she watched Jesus grow from a toddler to a teenager, and then into a young man

Christ is the first fruit of resurrection from the dead and then come those who belong to him. Next in line, belonging to him, is his mother, who is the model for the rest of the church.

Mary is a model of discipleship. Mary shows us a way of being, that is lasting, loving, and capable.

We must also remember that everything wasn't easy for her. In fact, the opposite would be nearer the truth. Mary spent much of her life on the move, setting out in haste, searching, fleeing. As the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph were refugees. Mary knew what it was like to experience fear and uncertainty in the face of the unknown.

Mary lived in a world of many broken promises, broken relationships, broken treaties, much as we do today.

All of us, like Mary, are on a journey. We are traveling to places we may not understand and to destinations we cannot see.

The road may be long, and the journey may not be easy, this is life.

Today we pray to have the trust and courage to travel whatever road we must take just as Mary did. Let us learn something from the woman we honour today, embrace what she represents, and resolve to make everyday count.

May we also learn from Mary to believe and hope and love, and may our longing also bring us to enjoy with her the communion with Jesus, which is our hearts desire and the goal of our existence

So we pray that Mary, given to us by Christ as our mother, be our companion on our journey of faith. John France

ENRICHING YOUNG MINDS: INSPIRING THE LEADERS OF TOMORROW

At CatholicCare's Refugee Hub, we support people from refugee, asylum-seeker, and vulnerable migrant backgrounds to settle into life in Australia. SARAH JAMES. Our Hub offers free weekly tutoring sessions for primary and secondary school students to support their learning in subjects, such as English and Maths.

Team Leader of the Refugee Hub, Mirja Colding-Moran, describes these sessions as invaluable for building life skills and supporting the children to integrate into their new community.

"We have already seen so many positive outcomes from the children we support at the Hub, including increased confidence and academic ability," she said.

Dedicated volunteers, many of whom are qualified teachers, come in and assist the children and young people with their schoolwork.

Fred and Aicha are just two of the young people who access the Refugee Hub's tutoring every week.

Aicha was born in Syria and later moved to a Refugee Camp in Lebanon, meaning she never had the opportunity to go to school until coming to Australia.

She has been tutored at the Refugee Hub for the last six months and receives help with assessments, homework, reading and writing.

"I find school very exciting. I always wanted to go to school. There was no school for me in the Refugee Camp in Lebanon," Aisha said.

Fred is from Kenya and has also been thriving since visiting the Refugee Hub's tutoring service. While his favourite subjects are Maths and Science, his dream for when he finishes school is to be a professional soccer player!

"When I leave school, I want to be a soccer player. Maybe I could go to the Olympics one day!"

The Refugee Hub does not receive any government funding for its essential services and relies solely on the generosity of people in the community to fund its programs.

"Imagine coming to a new country, and amongst all that change, being sent to school when you have never been before. The experience can be pretty daunting.

"We need your help to ensure more children thrive at school, supporting them to learn, and build important friendships and social connection with their peers, teachers and community," Mirja says.

The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

Rv 11:19; 12:1-6, 10

A reading from the book of the Apocalypse

I saw a woman clothed with the sun and with the moon at her feet.

The sanctuary of God in heaven opened, and the ark of the covenant could be seen inside it.

Now a great sign appeared in heaven: a woman, adorned with the sun, standing on the moon, and with the twelve stars on her head for a crown. She was pregnant, and in labour, crying aloud in the pangs of childbirth. Then a second sign appeared in the sky, a huge red dragon

which had seven heads and ten horns, and each of the seven heads crowned with a coronet. Its tail dragged a third of the stars from the sky and dropped them to the earth, and the dragon stopped in front of the woman as she was having the child, so that he could eat it as soon as it was born from its mother. The woman brought a male child into the world, the son who was to rule all the nations with an iron sceptre, and the child was taken straight up to God and to his throne, while the woman escaped into the desert, where God had made a place of safety ready. Then I heard a voice shout from heaven, 'Victory and power and empire for ever have been won by our God, and all authority for his Christ.'

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

As members of Christ all people will be raised, Christ first, and after him all who belong to him.

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order; Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be put under his feet.

Mary set out and went as quickly as she could to a town in the hill country of Judah. She went into Zechariah's house and greeted Elizabeth. Now as soon as Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the child leapt in her womb and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. She gave a loud cry and said, 'Of all women you are the most blessed, and blessed is the fruit of your womb. Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord? For the moment your greeting reached my ears, the child in my womb leapt for joy. Yes, blessed is she who believed that the promise made her by the Lord would be fulfilled.'

And Mary said:

'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord and my spirit exults in God my saviour;

because he has looked upon his lowly handmaid.

Yes, from this day forward all generations will call me blessed,

for the Almighty has done great things for me.

Holy is his name,

and his mercy reaches from age to age for those who fear him.

He has shown the power of his arm,

he has routed the proud of heart.

He has pulled down princes from their thrones and exalted the lowly.

The hungry he has filled with good things, the rich sent empty away.

He has come to the help of Israel his servant, mindful of his mercy

according to the promise he made to our ancestors –

of his mercy to Abraham and to his descendants for ever.'
