Dear Parish Family,

Trinity Sunday is always special to me.... I celebrated my Mass of Thanksgiving as a newly ordained priest on this feast. My actual anniversary was two weeks ago on the 1st June. One of the gifts for my ordination was a friend offered to preach at this Mass of thanksgiving.... thinking I would be exhausted having been ordained in the morning! So, He began... "The Trinity is mystery. In the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit". He then started to walk off. He did come back and preached after much applause and horror by the bishop who was present.

Is the Trinity mystery? Sometimes trying to explain God is simply inadequate with our language. Calling God our father - God is not like our human fathers; if we say God is creator then we reduce God to a functional role; or if we say God is male or female then we have locked God into what we might want but not what God is. Jesus revealed God as persons...Father, Son and Spirit. Now the biblical word for person comes from a Greek term ($\pi \rho \acute{o} \sigma \omega \pi o$) *prosopon* or a mask, just like a mask an actor might wear on a stage which designates the character that they are playing. Jesus revealed to us the Trinity through the Gospels that the Father has all and shares it with the Son; the Son in turn shares it with us and leave us with the Spirit as teacher and guide. The three are unified in purpose and is an invitation to enter into this relationship with God who is love.

One of my favourite pieces of art on the Trinity is by the fifteenth century monk Andrei Rublev. Rublev described the Trinity as the embodiment of *spiritual unity*, *equality, peace, harmony and mutual love* that beckons us welcome. A welcome at the table where love, peace and forgiveness are found. Baptised in the name of the trinity, we are called to share in the divine and shape our families and our communities to reflect this invitation. Do our families, friendships, homes, schools, communities reflect these?



Last Sunday and following on this Sunday we are holding our Gifting Sunday (s). Given last weekend many were away for the long weekend. On the pews and online there is a form where we ask you, as a disciple gifted in the Spirit, to volunteer your time and talent. There is an explanation of some of these ministries on the back of the form, as there are some new ministries such as Children's Liturgy, assisting with reading in one of our schools, youth ministry and many more What are the gifts that you can bring?

World Elder Abuse Awareness Day is recognised annually on 15 June and brings to light the cultural, social, economic and demographic factors that underpin the negative experiences of elderly populations. The World Health Organization defines the abuse of older people – or elder abuse – as "a single, or repeated act, or lack of appropriate action, occurring within any relationship where there is an expectation of trust which causes harm or distress to an older person." There are many ways to support the elderly within our communities and identify when further support is needed.

Elder Advocacy Webinar

Australian Catholic Safeguarding Ltd are holding a free webinar will focus on preventing and responding to the abuse of older people, and cover:

- How to recognise and respond to elder abuse.
- Supporting older people and their representatives to raise concerns and access services.


Parish Assembly-(Save the Date)
