Dear Parish Family,

“...Unbind him, let him go free.”

Next Sunday we celebrate Palm Sunday, so this weekend brings our final reflection on the themes that prepare those who are to be baptised at Easter—and help all of us renew our own baptismal promises: **water, light, and life**. On the Third Sunday, we heard of Jesus’ encounter with the Samaritan woman and the promise of living water. Last Sunday, we reflected on the healing of the man born blind, who, washing in the water of Siloam received sight. Today, we hear the powerful story of Lazarus, called from the tomb and restored to life.

These are not just stories—they are revelations of what Baptism does in us. The living water of Baptism satisfies our deepest spiritual thirst. The washing of Baptism brings us from blindness to seeing with the eyes of faith. And in Baptism, we die with Christ as we are plunged into the waters and rise with Him into new life. Jesus is the Resurrection and the Life. Through Baptism, we enter the Kingdom and share in eternal life.

The story of Lazarus is filled with a lot of emotion. Jesus is deeply moved—shaken to the core. The Greek word used (κράυξις) is a groan from our gut! That graphic. At the same time, Martha and Mary challenge Him: “If you had been here...” Their grief is real, yet their faith is rooted in the Jewish hope of resurrection—a future promise, the raising of the dead on the last day as spoken of by the prophet Ezekiel. But goes beyond future hope—He brings life into the present. When Lazarus walks out of the tomb, he is still bound in burial cloths. Jesus commands: “Unbind him and let him go free.” Lazarus is restored to life—but it is a temporary life. He will die again. This is not yet the fullness of resurrection. By contrast, on Easter Sunday, the tomb of Jesus will be empty—and the burial cloths will be left behind. His resurrection is not a return to earthly life, but a transformation into eternal life.

The raising of Lazarus sets in motion the final events of Jesus’ life. It leads directly to the decision of the authorities to arrest Him. In giving life to His friend, Jesus begins the journey toward His own death. In saving Lazarus, He signs His own death warrant. And the Gospel makes this clear: Jesus gives His life so that not only Lazarus—but all of us—may truly live.

All the symbols we have reflected on come together now. The white garment recalls the glory of the Transfiguration. The water speaks of new life. The candle represents the light of faith. And today, we are given another image: freedom. “Unbind him and let him go free.” In the Baptismal rite, there is a prayer over the ears and mouth—that they may be opened to hear God’s Word and to proclaim the faith. To be truly alive in Christ is to listen, to hear, to speak and to be freed from all that binds us.

Thank you to all who have submitted your feedback regarding the review of our weekend Mass times. This is the final weekend to have your say. As mentioned, no decisions have yet been made, and I will update you in the coming weeks when further consultation is needed.

A few events are taking place this weekend and week.... St Joseph’s Parish will be holding a BBQ at Bunnings in support of the Toronto kitchen which assists the homeless etc. Also, at St Joseph’s Toronto on Sunday, we will have a Reconciliation service in preparation for Easter. It will begin with the Way of the Cross at 2pm—all are most welcome. Wednesday evening there will also be a Reconciliation Service at St John Vianney, Morisset from 6.30pm.

First Reading (Ezekiel 37:12-14)

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

The Lord says this: I am now going to open your graves; I mean to raise you from your graves, my people, and lead you back to the soil of Israel. And you will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and raise you from your graves, my people. And I shall put my spirit in you, and you will live, and I shall resettle you on your own soil; and you will know that I, the Lord, have said and done this – it is the Lord who speaks.

Responsorial Psalm (Ps 129. R. v.7)

(R.) With the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption.

1. Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord, Lord, hear my voice! O let your ears be attentive to the voice of my pleading. **(R.)**
2. If you, O Lord, should mark our guilt, Lord, who would survive? But with you is found forgiveness: for this we revere you. **(R.)**
3. My soul is waiting for the Lord, I count on his word. My soul is longing for the Lord more than watchman for daybreak. (Let the watchman count on daybreak and Israel on the Lord.) **(R.)**
4. Because with the Lord there is mercy and fullness of redemption, Israel indeed he will redeem from all its iniquity. **(R.)**

Second Reading (Romans 8:8-11)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ!
I am the resurrection and the life, says the Lord;
whoever believes in me will not die for ever.

Gospel (John 11:3-7. 17. 20-27. 33-45)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

The sisters Martha and Mary sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?'

'Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.' Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him, 'Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:

'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer. I knew indeed that you always hear me, but I speak for the sake of all these who stand round me, so that they may believe it was you who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.'

Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.
