Todays Gospel presents us with Jesus' teaching on prayer, and it is directly related to our call to mission.

The words Jesus gives to pray, known as The Lord's Prayer, have been handed down through many generations, as the most beloved prayer in the Christian tradition.

We are not living in the golden era of Christianity. There never has been a golden era- each time has its own challenges.

True Christians today are known by the quality of their witness.

Australia is a very lucky country. But we still have a lot of work to do in terms of creating a more just, inclusive and compassionate society for everyone.

This creates a challenge for Christians. It means that we are no longer respected simply by our membership in the biggest institution. We are challenged to show our worth by our action and God's call to live our discipleship as a matter of fact.

SUNDAY 17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME- 24 JULY,2022 "Teach us to Pray"

Today's readings give an interesting insight to "Prayer". In Genesis, Abraham practiced his collective bargaining with God, bit by bit knocking him down to save the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah. His premise was that if one bad apple can spoil the barrel, then, in this story, Abraham asks God if a minority of good people can save the rest. Would God spare them if there were 50 good people there..... or 40...or even just 10?

Jesus' approach was different. He structured his prayer in 5 phases, and almost all our prayers today follow that pattern.

First he named God.. Not as the name we are not to speak, but, simply as "Father", or "Abba"- not a usual way in that time

- Although he calls God "Father' he then reminds us just who the Father is- he is not just a buddy. In the "Hallowed be Thy name", we are reminded never to forget God's grandeur- this is the creator of the universe, the eternal source of life. Yet this same hallowed One invites us to call him "Father".
- Then we continue with "your kingdom come", it summarises the goal of Christian life. When we pray this with fervor and integrity we are pledging ourselves to the cause of Christ. We situate ourselves in the presence of God as people intimately loved by the Almighty and fully committed to God's cause.
- Then we acknowledge our dependence on God and our need for grace. "Give us this day our daily bread"... is a way of saying our daily needs to survive, we also need the bread of the morrow, the life-giving bread blessed and broken in community. "And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors" ...This is double edged, if we ask for God's forgiveness, re recognise that it also means we must repay: I cannot hope for forgiveness if I withhold it.
- "And do not put us to the test"- This last petition to not be put to the final test finds an echo on the Mount of Olives when Jesus asks to be spared the cup. As he taught his disciples to pray, so in his moment of testing, Jesus asked for it to pass, but he summed up his life's work by saying, "Not my will but yours be done".

This whole prayer summarises Jesus' relationship with God. By giving it to us, he invites us into that same relationship.

I don't know about you, but I feel that when I pray this, I need to have my seat belt done up. If we pray this properly, our lives will never be the same. A scary thought. Uta


